## Double O

Most verbs in the Greek language end in 'o'. Rarely does a Greek verb end in two 'o's. One 'o' means refers to the verb in action. Double 'o' means that it will be seen. In Ephesians 3:16 the word 'strengthened' is *krataioo*. In 2 Timothy 4:17 the word 'strengthened' is *endunamoo*. It conveys more than just being strengthened. It means to be shown to be strong. It will be seen on the outside and not just experienced on the inside. God will demonstrate it and make people see it.

How can power be visible? Acts 11:23 speaks of people seeing the grace of God in the move that happened in Antioch. It could not be explained with human reasoning. No one initiated the move.
